Fisherton de la Mere - River Wylye


Fishery Rules:

River Wylye Dower House Fisherton de la Mere.

1. All rods must be in possession of an EA rod licence. online purchase.
2. Fishing only from banks marked on fishery plan only.
3. Upstream dry fly and nymph only.
4. All rods to register on arrival in the logbook in the fishing room at the Dower House and to sign out on leaving the fishery.
5. One brace of fish may be taken per rod per day. All fish less than 12 inches and all Grayling to be returned. Fishing may continue after reaching the limit on a catch and release basis (up to a total of 6 sizeable fish per rod) with barbless or de-barbed hooks.
6. Wading is permitted but only where necessary. Great care must be taken at all times. No wading between Mill Pool and house bridge.
7. All visitors shall avoid damage to any property and use only those points of access as shown on the fishery map.
8. No litter to be left on the fishery. Rubbish bags are provided in the fishery hut.
9. Dogs are not allowed on the fishery. One non-angling companion is permitted provided he/she stays with the licensed rod.
10. No responsibility is accepted by the owners of the fishery , their Lessees or their agents for any damage or injury caused to or sustained by any rod (or guest) or his property, howsoever caused.

A live power line crosses the river above the Dower Housel. This is clearly signed and well out of reach, but as it poses a theoretical danger, we are required to point it out by the owner of the Fishery, please read information regarding health and safety issues that might affect you whilst fishing.

Please report any apparent unauthorised fishing.



Risk Assessment Sheet for Famous Fishing Ltd. River Beats and Lakes 2018

HAZARD	RISK	CONTROL
Flowing water	Drowning	Anglers advised strong currents can be hazardous
Deep holes in river bed	Drowning	Anglers advised of the risk of deep holes and to take care
Crossing bridges, stiles, fences and ditches	Slipping, tripping and falling	Anglers advised to only use crossing places provided and to take care, especially in weather conditions when surfaces may be slippery.
Uneven ground surfaces	Tripping and falling	Anglers advised to take care when walking
Steep banks	Slipping and falling	Anglers advised these can be slippery and to take care
Electric cattle fences	Electrocution	Anglers are advised to expect these to be on and to cross at the protected places
Vehicular access points	Driving accident	Anglers are advised to exercise extreme caution at all entry and exit points
Car Parking	Driving accident/damage to fishermen's cars etc.	Anglers are advised that all vehicles are parked entirely at their own risk

Hazard	Risk	Control
Farm Machinery and farm stock	Accident	Anglers are advised that both can be dangerous at close proximity and to keep well away from both
Overhead power lines	Electrocution	Anglers are banned from fishing under power lines. Please keep well clear of all power lines and remember the overall length of your rod and line.
Leptospirosis (Weil's disease)	Pathogen infection	Anglers to cover any cuts / abrasions on hands. Wash hands prior to eating / smoking.
Sharp hooks / flies	Damage to eyes	Always wear sunglasses and a peaked cap / hat whilst on river
Lyme Disease, Tick-borne	Pathogen infection	Cover exposed skin and apply suitable insect repellent. Check for any ticks on exposed skin and remove by recommended means or consult doctor. Be aware of Lyme disease symptoms and seek medical advice.
