




Trout Fishery Rules

1. All rods must be in possession of an EA rod licence available [online here](#) or from any Post Office.
2. Strickly NO rod sharing
3. Bag Limit: One and a half brace of Trout may be taken per day. Rainbow Trout and Grayling will not count towards the bag limit. All diseased fish must be killed and disposed of discreetly.
4. Fishing is by upstream dryfly only.
5. Wading is not necessary and is therefore not permitted as it damages the riverbed.
6. Dogs must be kept under control at all times. The keeper reserves the right to request any dog to be removed that is causing a nuisance.
7. Litter should not be left in the fishing huts or on the river banks. All litter must be taken home. Please do not gut fish in the fishing huts or on the river bank.
8. All catches must be recorded in the books provided in the fishing huts in order that the river may remain adequately stocked. The level of stocking will be dependent upon the recorded catches on each beat.
9. Rods are restricted to fishing the beat assigned to them.
10. When fishing Beats 1, 2 and 3 rods are requested to keep the number of cars on the River bank to an absolute minimum. The tracks cross old water meadows and are liable to become soft at times.
11. The Estate (Westover Farm Partnership) or Famous Fishing does not hold responsibility for loss or damage to property belonging to any of the rods or their guests. Similarly the Estate or Famous Fishing does not hold responsibility for any personal injury to the rods themselves or their guests whilst on the property. GRAYLING FISHING RULES

- 1 Barbless hooks must be used, handle fish carefully with wet hands, and return quickly and carefully to the water. Please kill and discreetly dispose of any diseased fish all other fish to be returned.
 2. Fishing is by single fly and single nymph only, using traditional patterns and sizes. The use of a small dry fly as an indicator fished New Zealand style is permitted.
 3. Wading is not necessary and is therefore not permitted as it damages the riverbed.
 4. Dogs must be kept under control at all times. The Keeper reserves the right to request any dog to be removed that is causing a nuisance.
 5. Litter should not be left in the fishing huts or on the river banks. All litter must be taken home, and take particular care with discarded line as it is extremely hazardous to wildlife. Please cut into small sections before disposal.
 6. All Rods must be in possession of an Environment Agency Licence.
 7. Rods are not restricted to fishing a Beat, but are asked to maintain a respectful distance from any other Rods fishing.
 8. When fishing Beats 1, 2 and 3 rods are requested to keep the number of cars on the River bank to an absolute minimum.
- NB: The water meadows can become very wet and treacherous during the Winter months, and Rods without four wheel drive must leave vehicles on the old railway line or by the entrance gate to the Fishery, carefully parked and not restricting access.
- The Estate (Westover Farm Partnership) is not responsible for vehicles that become stuck, and cannot guarantee the safe recovery of such vehicles.
9. The Estate (Westover Farm Partnership) does not hold itself responsible for loss or damage to any property belonging to Rods. Similarly the Estate does not hold itself responsible for any personal injury to the Rods themselves or their guests whilst on the property.
 10. **Please do not target trout whilst grayling fishing.**

Risk Assessment Sheet for Famous Fishing Ltd. River Beats and Lakes 2018

HAZARD	RISK	CONTROL
Flowing water	Drowning	Anglers advised strong currents can be hazardous
Deep holes in river bed	Drowning	Anglers advised of the risk of deep holes and to take care
Crossing bridges, stiles, fences and ditches	Slipping, tripping and falling	Anglers advised to only use crossing places provided and to take care, especially in weather conditions when surfaces may be slippery.
Uneven ground surfaces	Tripping and falling	Anglers advised to take care when walking
Steep banks	Slipping and falling	Anglers advised these can be slippery and to take care
Electric cattle fences	Electrocution	Anglers are advised to expect these to be on and to cross at the protected places
Vehicular access points	Driving accident	Anglers are advised to exercise extreme caution at all entry and exit points
Car Parking	Driving accident/damage to fishermen's cars etc.	Anglers are advised that all vehicles are parked entirely at their own risk
Farm Machinery and farm stock	Accident	Anglers are advised that both can be dangerous at close proximity and to keep well away from both
Overhead power lines	Electrocution	Anglers are banned from fishing under power lines. Please keep well clear of all power lines and remember the overall length of your rod and line.
Leptospirosis (Weil's disease)	Pathogen infection	Anglers to cover any cuts / abrasions on hands. Wash hands prior to eating / smoking.
Sharp hooks / flies	Damage to eyes	Always wear sunglasses and a peaked cap / hat whilst on river
Lyme Disease, Tick-borne	Pathogen infection	Cover exposed skin and apply suitable insect repellent. Check for any ticks on exposed skin and remove by recommended means or consult doctor. Be aware of Lyme disease symptoms and seek medical advice.
